

HEART OF THE ANDES 8 DAYS / 7 NIGHTS

Sacred Valley – Machu Picchu – Cusco – Humantay Lake – Southern Valley

Immerse yourself in the cultural, spiritual, and natural richness of the Peruvian Andes. This 8day, 7-night journey is thoughtfully designed for travelers seeking more than just sightseeing it's a pathway into authentic and transformative experiences. From iconic Inca ruins and breathtaking highland landscapes to vibrant living culture and hands-on traditions, each day opens a new window into the heritage and beauty of one of the world's most remarkable civilizations.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL IN CUSCO - SACRED VALLEY

Upon arrival at Cusco Airport, a Perú Increíble representative will warmly welcome you and transfer you directly to the Sacred Valley of the Incas. Located at a lower altitude than Cusco, it provides a gentler acclimatization to the Andes.

Along the way, enjoy scenic stops to admire the dramatic Andean landscape and observe daily life in traditional highland communities. The rest of the day is free to relax at the hotel, enjoy the peaceful surroundings, and adjust to the local pace.

DAY 2: MARAS - MORAY - PISAC

After breakfast, begin your day exploring Moray, a mysterious circular complex believed to be an Inca agricultural laboratory. Continue to the Salineras de Maras, where thousands of terraced salt pools carved into the mountainside are still harvested by local families using techniques passed down since pre-Inca times.

Enjoy a buffet lunch at Tunupa Restaurant, located in Urubamba and overlooking the Urubamba River. In the afternoon, explore the archaeological site of Pisac, known for its impressive terraces, irrigation canals, and panoramic valley views. You'll also have time to browse Pisac's vibrant artisan market, offering a colorful array of handmade crafts and traditional textiles.

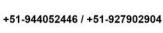

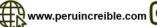
DAY 3: ANDEAN POTTERY WORKSHOP - OLLANTAYTAMBO - AGUAS CALIENTES

After breakfast, take part in a hands-on Andean ceramics workshop at Kintu Studio, where you'll learn time-honored techniques passed down through generations. Using locally sourced materials, you'll craft your own piece while exploring the symbolic meanings found in Inca art and design.













Enjoy a delicious lunch in the Sacred Valley before visiting the extraordinary Ollantaytambo Fortress, an Inca stronghold featuring ceremonial fountains, temples, and agricultural terraces. Ollantaytambo is one of the last living Inca towns, where centuries-old homes and cobblestone streets remain in use to this day.

In the late afternoon, board the scenic Vistadome train to Aguas Calientes. As you wind along the Urubamba River, enjoy views of cloud forests and steep mountain slopes. Upon arrival, settle into your hotel and enjoy a relaxing evening in Machu Picchu Pueblo. Optional: unwind at the local hot springs.

DAY 4: MACHU PICCHU - CUSCO

Today is one of the highlights of your journey. After an early breakfast, board the bus to Machu Picchu, arriving in time to experience the morning light as it illuminates the sacred citadel - a breathtaking sight for many travelers.

Enjoy a guided tour of approximately three hours, visiting temples, plazas, agricultural terraces, and ceremonial sites. Your expert guide will bring the history, symbolism, and spiritual significance of this wonder of the world to life. Optional: For those seeking a more challenging experience, hike Huayna Picchu or Machu Picchu Mountain (advance reservations required and subject to availability).

After your visit, return to Aguas Calientes for lunch, then board the train to Ollantaytambo, where a private transfer will take you back to Cusco.

DAY 5: FREE MORNING – PERUVIAN COOKING CLASS

Enjoy a free morning to explore Cusco's historic center, visit museums or colonial churches, or relax with a coffee in the Plaza de Armas.

In the afternoon, take part in a hands-on Peruvian cooking class led by a local chef. Begin with a guided visit to a local market to discover vibrant Peruvian ingredients, followed by a culinary workshop where you'll prepare a traditional four-course meal (vegetarian option available) and learn how to craft a classic Pisco Sour (non-alcoholic version also available).

This immersive culinary experience is a delicious way to connect with Peru's rich flavors and cultural heritage.

DAY 6: HUMANTAY LAKE HIKE

Begin your day early with a 4:30 a.m. departure from Cusco to the mountain village of Mollepata, where a hearty Andean breakfast awaits. Continue to Soraypampa, the trailhead for your hike to Humantay Lake.

The 1.5 to 2-hour uphill trek takes you to 4,200 meters (13,800 feet), with panoramic views of snow-capped peaks, the towering Salkantay Glacier, and lush valleys. Though the hike is demanding due to the altitude, the beauty of the turquoise lake and surrounding Andes makes every step worth it.

At the summit, you'll have time to take in the views, rest, and optionally participate in a traditional Pachamama offering to honor Mother Earth. After descending, return to Mollepata for a buffet lunch before arriving back in Cusco in the late afternoon.

DAY 7: SOUTHERN VALLEY TOUR

This morning, explore the lesser-known Southern Valley, rich in archaeological wonders and colonial architecture. Highlights include:

- Tipón A masterclass in Inca hydraulic engineering, with sophisticated canals still functioning today.
- Pikillaqta A pre-Inca Wari city featuring organized urban planning and adobe structures.
- Andahuaylillas A colonial village home to the "Sistine Chapel of the Andes," renowned for its intricate murals and gilded altar.

Return to Cusco in the early afternoon. Enjoy your final evening at leisure - shop for souvenirs, revisit your favorite plaza, or celebrate with a farewell dinner in the historic center.
